Achieving the Level 5 DET typically involves a combination of theoretical learning and practical teaching experience. The qualification is recognized by educational institutions and employers in the United Kingdom and is often considered a valuable credential for those pursuing a career in teaching or training within the post-compulsory education sector.

Get Teacher Status without a Degree

Getting your QTLS is a quicker and cheaper alternative to the traditional QTS (Qualified Teacher Status) route. Since 2012 the Qualified Teacher Learning and Skills (QTLS) has held equal status with QTS, so with this status, you will be able to call yourself a fully qualified teacher.

The good news here is that gaining the QTLS is straightforward – you won't need to go through the elongated process of being a Newly Qualified Teacher (NQT) first. That means that once you've got your QTLS- that's it! You can tick the "Yes" box on any application form or survey asking if you are a qualified teacher.

Requirements

Entry Requirements

- All trainee teachers joining this qualification programme should undertake an initial assessment of skills in English, mathematics and information and communication technology (ICT).
- Learners registered on this qualification should not undertake another qualification at the same level with the same or a similar title.
- Minimum core of literacy, language, numeracy and ICT

Learners are not required to have achieved a Level 3 Award in Education and Training or a Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training before undertaking a Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training. However, some learners may already have completed one or both of these qualifications.

Minimum Age Restriction

• The learner's age must be 19 and above

Practice Requirement

The practice component is a vital aspect of high-quality initial teacher training. This qualification requires learners to complete a work/industry placement experience throughout the duration of the qualification.

There is a requirement for a minimum of **100 hours of practice** and a requirement to work with groups of learners to achieve this qualification.

There must be a minimum of **8 observations totalling a minimum of 8 hours**. Any single observation must be a minimum of **30 minutes**.

Assessment Requirements

Assessments will be carried out using various evaluation mediums such as, observation of practice, witness statements, reflections, case studies, placement log and written assignments.

Each learner must create a portfolio of evidence generated from appropriate assessment tasks that demonstrates the achievement of all the learning outcomes associated with each unit. The learner will complete internally assessed work in accordance with the qualification specification.

FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions)

- 1. Can my teaching hours be completed at primary level?
- Yes, the teaching hours can be completed at a primary level.
- 2. Can I bring forward any credit or observed and assessed practice from Level 3 Award in Education and Training (AET) course?
- Learners who have completed the Level 3 Award in Education and Training and who are progressing directly to the Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training cannot bring forward any credit or observed and assessed practice.

3. Can I transfer any credit or observed and assessed practice from Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training (CET) course?

 Trainee teachers who have achieved the Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training can transfer 20 hours of practice and 2 hours of observed and assessed practice towards the practice requirements of the Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training.

4. Can I teach with a Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training?

 The course may lead to employment as a qualified teacher or to increased responsibility and advancement in your current position. If you complete the course successfully, you will be able to apply for the Qualified Teacher, Learning and Skills (QTLS) status, which will allow you to teach in secondary schools.

5. Can I provide the proof of 100 hours of teaching without working for an organisation?

• You do not need to be employed to complete 100 hours of teaching practice. You can do that voluntarily.

6. Who will complete the observations for the Level 5 DET (Diploma in Education and Training) course?

Your colleagues, peers, or your supervisor can conduct the observations.

Those who will be observing practice for the Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training must have all of the following:

- 1. a teaching qualification equivalent to level 5 or above
- 2. evidence of relevant teaching experience in an education or training context
- 3. access to appropriate guidance and support
- 4. ongoing participation in related programme quality assurance processes

7. Can I gain QTLS status with this course?

- Yes, you can apply for QTLS upon completion of this course.
- 8. Is it necessary to finish the Level 3 Award or Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training before starting the Level 5 DET?
- No, you can start Level 5 DET without doing Level 3 Award or Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training.

9. How will this course benefit my teaching skills?

 The course provides practical insights into effective teaching techniques, inclusive teaching approaches, and assessment strategies, enhancing your ability to create engaging and supportive learning environments.

10. How do I submit the assignment?
